In case you can't tell, I really, really like saving money on gas. I've talked about GasBuddy on more than one occasion, and an almost natural supplement that would fuellog. FuelLog is a thorough, straightforward application that tracks your average gas mileage as well as costs over time. At its core, FuelLog is all about tracking your fill-ups and providing feedback about your miles per gallon, as well as being informed about your costs during each filling and how many days have happened between fill-ups. It's graphically simple, but it doesn't have to be cracking, just functional. And it's functional. You start with the Add Fill button. From there, you get to the screen with all the basic information: reading the odometer, how much fuel you bought and the cost of a gallon. From there, FuelLog does all the relevant math and you get your first reading. There is also the option to add a note, let's say you just towed a cross-country trailer, so that's why your gas mileage is probably in landfills. The more fills you add, the better fuellog will be. With more information, FuelLog can tell you that the best gas mileage, your worst, and your average. It is marked with green, red and yellow kilometers on the list screen, but really stands out when you move to the Stats tab. The Cost tab is for all incidental expenses (such as repairs) that you will have to pay for your vehicle. It's a pretty extensive list of options, from one-time costs to monthly and even quarterly. There are still standard fields for odometer and cost, but you can also name the cost (like Ran to tree) and add a note. The Statistics tab is one of fuellog's most impressive features, giving you two options: Charts or Values. Values are a series of tables that display things like fuel consumption, accumulated costs, total refills and purchased fuel quantities, total costs, and a long table of averages. It's quite comprehensive, and if there's anything you need to know about your expenses or driving ad, it's here. When you flip charts, you'll see one line chart, but you can change what you're viewing. This is one of the features that illustrates how powerful FuelLog can be as they continue to accumulate more data about you. Don't think you're limited to just one chart. While you can only view one chart at a time, there's plenty to choose from, such as fuel consumption, trips, total odometer, and fuel price. For the visual students among us, that's quite the key. The last card is a calculator that will help you estimate how many gallons you will burn if you drive a certain number of kilometers or vice versa, how many kilometers you will probably be able to drive based on a certain number of gallons in the tank. Overall, I think fuellog is essential for all cost-minded people, especially if you care about improving your driving habits. Fortunately, FuelLog is but not without its limitations. Free version remembers only max 10 10 on the charts, so if you want to track things long-term, I'd suggest ponying up ~\$2.72 per license key. The full version will also get rid of ads, as well as allow you to import or export a file to FuelLog, so you can keep the spreadsheet on your computer without much hassle.
